

America's Second Harvest takes hunger relief to the road.

America's Second Harvest of Coastal Georgia provided groceries to more than 450 low-income families in Pembroke on July 12th with the help of Mayor Judy Cook, Janis Blunt of United Way, and volunteers from partner agencies. With the support of the Hancock Family Foundation, Second Harvest has started a [Mobile Pantry Program](#) to bring food directly to families in need in its rural communities. In Bryan County, 3,222 individuals live below the poverty level. Of those, 1,061 are children and 206 are 65 or older (U.S. Census 2000). Food insecurity may affect even more families as the poverty rate is measured at a mere \$20,650 for a family of 4. With the help of the Mobile Pantry Program, families receive 2-4 bags of groceries, or nearly 15,000 pounds of food.
